BITE-SIZED CHATS



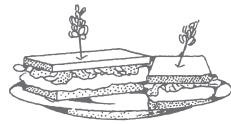
These short sessions are virtual or in-person guest speaker opportunities featuring industry leaders. The goal is to expose students to a variety of career options and experiences.

Students and industry partners will engage in discussions about workplace activities, training, and pathways. The relaxed environment of a lunch conversation provides participants with the opportunity to get to know one another. Industry partners are asked to provide lunch.

CAREER CONVERSATION SERIES

Industry partners can participate in a sequence of classroom conversations about career exploration, industry knowledge, and career-specific topics through this series. Formats include speaker presentations, panels, and roundtable discussions.

CAREER READINESS VIDEOS

Record a video to share your knowledge, skills, and guidance on how to plan for a variety of careers. These videos will be archived for students and teachers to prepare for future internships and employment.

WORKSITE TOURS

Worksite tours are an innovative way to show students real-life views of the workplace. Small or large groups of students can travel to the job site or tour virtually.

Suggested Time: 1-3 Hours

PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

Project-based learning allows students to explore real-world challenges as industry partners guide them through a design and problem solving process.

Suggested Time: 1-3 Hours

Audience: Grades 6 - 12

JOB SHADOWING

Students shadow healthcare professionals to experience a typical day in the workplace. Visits are observational only.

Suggested Time: Up to 8 hours

Audience: Grades 9-12



STUDENT INTERNSHIPS

Internships offer an opportunity to provide hands-on, work-based learning experiences for high school students.

Suggested Time: 6 - 12 Weeks

(maximum of 60 student hours)

Audience: Grades 11 - 12

Externships are hands-on experiences for teachers to stay current with industry standards and trends to ensure that they can share relevant information on careers and training with their students.
